

Batteries (Alkaline-household) shall mean any long-lived dry cell with an alkaline electrolyte that decreases corrosion of the cell in order to store electrical energy for use in many consumer products.

Batteries (Nickel-Cadmium/Nickel-Hydride/rechargeable) shall mean any nickel-cadmium cell (commonly abbreviated NiCd or NiCad) using nickel oxide hydroxide and metallic cadmium as electrodes in order to store electrical energy. These are a type of rechargeable battery.

RESTRICTIONS:

- * No 'out-of-town' batteries. All waste batteries delivered to the Holly Hill facility MUST have been generated within the Town of Greenwich.
- * Out of Town businesses working for Greenwich residents or Greenwich businesses MUST have a signed and dated verification letter from the Greenwich resident or Greenwich business for any batteries delivered. See sample [Verification of Owner Form](#).
- * NO bags. ONLY LOOSE batteries are accepted!
- * Separate alkaline batteries from Nickel-Cadmium/Nickel-Hydride/rechargeable batteries
- * DO NOT bring batteries to Household Hazardous Waste Collection day.

FEES:

- * \$0.00 There is no charge for batteries from residential/commercial sources.

Where are the Alkaline Battery and Rechargeable Battery drop-off areas?

In one of the well-marked blue Toter-style bins on the Operations Field, next to the attendant's shed. The Operations Field is at the bottom of the hill, across from the Trash Transfer Building.
