

**Prescription Medicines** shall mean any medicines that were prescribed by a physician. These may be unwanted or expired or unexpired prescription medicines. These may include but are not limited to dangerous, powerful, or habit-forming controlled substances; and may include opioids (oxycodone [OxyContin], hydrocodone [Vicodin], and meperidine [Demerol]), stimulants (methylphenidate [Ritalin] and amphetamine/dextroamphetamine [Adderall]), depressants (pentobarbital sodium [Nembutal], diazepam [Valium], and alprazolam [Xanax]) that are commonly abused.

**RESTRICTIONS:**

- \* DO NOT DUMP prescription medicines down the toilet or sink
- \* DO NOT BRING prescription medicines to Holly Hill
- \* DO NOT LEAVE prescription medicines in front of the Police station.
- \* No names are taken or collected.

**FEES:**

- \* \$0.00        There is no charge for drop-off of prescription medicines to the collection box at the Greenwich Public Safety building.

**Where is prescription medicine collection box?**

The prescription medicine collection box is a green mailbox underneath the walkway in the lobby of the Greenwich Public Safety building (the Police Station). The Greenwich Public Safety building is located at 11 Bruce Place, Greenwich, Connecticut (just a few hundred feet east of Greenwich Avenue). The prescription medicine collection box is an un-manned operation within the foyer, open 24 hours, 7 days a week. There is no prescription medicine collection box at the Holly Hill Facility.
