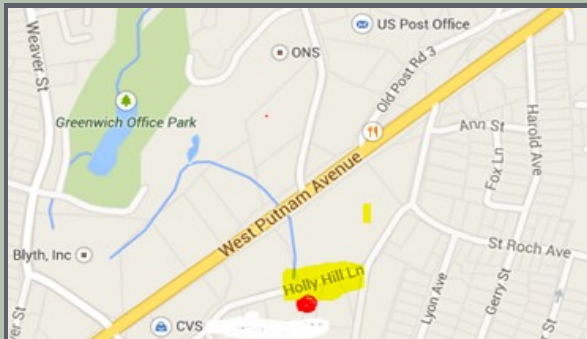
Recycling & Specialty-Waste Disposal Services

Holly Hill is the waste disposal and recycling facility for Greenwich residents. Trash, Recyclables and other items are accepted daily.

Monday-Friday 7am - 2:30pm
Saturday 7am - noon

Collection Areas at Holly Hill

- **Air conditioners** * and dehumidifiers, freezers, refrigerators
- **American Flags**, ripped, torn
- **Anti-freeze** (in sealed container)
- **Batteries**, household & rechargeable
- **Batteries**, auto
- **Construction Debris** * wooden furniture, shelving, lumber, cement, sheetrock, bathroom fixtures, pallets
- **E-Waste** includes electric & electronic items with a plug, circuit board, cathode tube
- **Fluorescent light bulbs**
- **Motor oil** (in sealed container)
- **Propane / LPG BBQ grill tanks**, empty
- **Single Stream Recycling**
- **Scrap metal**, large pieces and objects
- **Tires**, on or off rim *
- **Trash**
- **Yard waste**, leaves, branches, stumps

* stop at Scale House - fee required

Our Goal is to keep recyclables and re-usable items out of the trash



Goodwill Collection at Holly Hill

Goodwill provides an on-site collection at Holly Hill next to recycling area. Questions: 203-661-5520

- Clothing, shoes
- Coats, outerwear, boots
- Household, kitchen items
- Furniture
- Sheets, towels, blankets
- Sports equipment

Book Shed at Holly Hill

- Donate or browse for books to take home
- Shed is located in the recycling area
- Shed is operated by volunteers and is open Friday and Saturday mornings only

Seasonal & Specialty Recycling

- **Leaves and yard waste** are accepted all year long at Holly Hill yard waste collection area.
- **Household Hazardous Waste** collection is held one Saturday each Spring to allow proper disposal of household chemicals, fungicides, flammable, corrosive, toxic and poisonous items, oil based paints. Check town website or call 203-869-6910
- **Paper Shredding** is held on a Saturday in Spring and Fall to allow safe disposal of your personal and sensitive documents. Shreds are recycled. Check Town website or Email: GreenwichRecycles@gmail.com
- **Christmas Trees** are collected during January at Byram Beach, Bruce Park playground and Greenwich Point as well as Holly Hill. Residents may pick up wood chips at parks.



What goes into Trash?

- Food scraps
- Items contaminated by food or household chemicals
- Items containing more than one material like a 3-ring binder, pen, pencil
- Paper towels, tissues, band-aids
- Rubber and latex
- Rugs, upholstered furniture, stuffed toys
- Wicker baskets

Please Keep Recyclables and Hazardous/Toxic Materials OUT of the trash.

Your hauler can answer questions about items you want to recycle or safely discard

Cleaning out your attic or garage?

Call your hauler to arrange for an extra pick-up or dumpster when you have heavy or large items, and when you have more than normal weekly household trash and recycling.

Residents may also drop off at Holly Hill.

You & your hauler When your trash doesn't fit in your bin

Greenwich has over 25 licensed haulers (see website) who pick up trash and recyclables from residences and commercial properties. When haulers reach Holly Hill, materials must be sorted properly before tipping. Ask your hauler for guidelines for sorting trash and recyclables for pickup.



Single Stream Recycling

Includes ALL Cardboard, Ceramics, Glass, Metals, Paper, Plastics

Single Stream recyclables can be picked up at home by your hauler or you may recycle at Holly Hill.

**All items must be Clean and Loose
Empty all bags—Remove caps & lids**

- **Bags** (all paper, all plastic)
- **Boxes** (clean, empty, flattened)
- **Books, Phone Books** (paper & hardcover)
- **Cans** (all cans, clean and empty)
- **Cardboard** (flattened)
- **Ceramics** (plates, vases, bowls)
- **Glass** (bottles, window panes, mirrors)
- **Metal** (empty cans, caps & lids, screws, cutlery, aluminum foil, empty aerosol cans)
- **Milk Cartons, Drink Boxes** (empty, clean)
- **Newspapers** (remove plastic sleeve)
- **Office Papers** (all paper, labels, all envelopes, overnight mailers, stickers, folders)
- **Paper** (magazines, junk mail, cards, envelopes, notebooks, shreds, clean & empty juice and milk boxes, office paper, clean food packages)
- **Pizza Boxes** (clean)
- **Plastics** (bags, bottles, caps & lids, toys, CDs, tubs, jugs, egg cartons)
- **Styrofoam** (blocks and peanuts)
- **Take-Out** food containers (clean)



What about ?

- **Cell phones?** Drop off at E-waste at Holly Hill or in box at Town Hall or Perrot Library
- **Eye Glasses?** Lions Club collection box at Perrot Library
- **Ink jet cartridges?** Accepted at Staples
- **Metal Hangers?** Return to dry cleaner or put in household recycling bin
- **Paint?** Drop off at Keough's Paint and Hardware on High Ridge Road in Stamford
- **Personal Documents?** Bring to Shredding Day held in Spring and Fall
- **Prescription Medicine?** Drop in collection box at Police station. Do not flush
- **Sneakers?** Drop off at a Nike store for recycling or donate if still wearable
- **Styrofoam peanuts?** Drop at UPS store, Holly Hill (next to book shed) or put in household recycling
- **Toxic chemicals?** Drop off at Household Hazardous Waste Day held each Spring
