Western Greenwich Civic Center (10 acres)

This busy civic center is located on Glenville Road in Glenville. From the Post Road, take Dearfield Drive north to the rotary, where Glenville Road begins. Western Greenwich Civic Center is two miles on the left. It occupies ten acres of parkland, including two ballfields and a playground, as well as the large former school building. Parking is available in lots both north and south of the building.

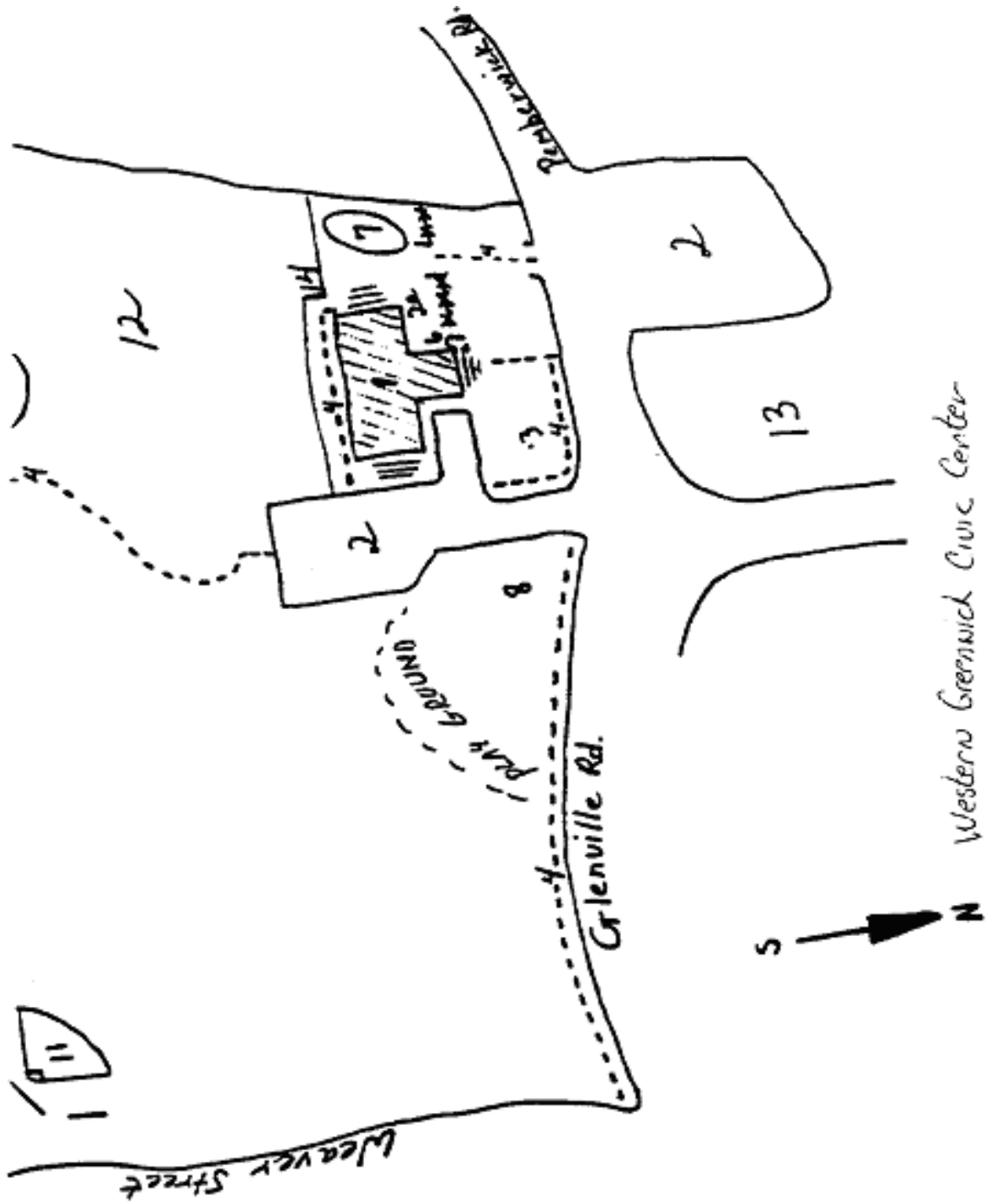
The property has two distinct levels. On the upper level is the playground. The building, ballfields and parking lots are on the lower level.

On the grounds of Western Civic Center can be found a mixed collection of deciduous and evergreen trees. Adjacent to the building there are flowering crabapple and dogwood trees with hemlocks spotted between them. On the roadside we find Norway Maple, Sugar Maple, Linden, Globe Locust, Ginko, and a newly planted row of Sycamore. To the rear of the building a stairway climbs the hill and is lined with spruce and white pine. Spotted over the hillside are mature Shagbark, Hickory, Locust, red Maple and Oak.

The Civic Center building is used for a variety of programs, such as scout groups, continuing education and other classes, a café, thrift shop, indoor sports, and playgroups. It is open weekdays from 8:00 am to 9:45 pm, closed on Saturdays, and used by a religious group on Sundays.

The white columned Georgian brick building with its gold-topped bell tower first opened its doors in 1920 as the Glenville grammar school, and for 55 years served as the educational institution for Glenville boys and girls. On July 1, 1975, after the new Glenville school opened on Riversville Road, the old school was transferred to the Parks & Recreation and re-opened as the new Western Greenwich Civic Center. For the past 24 years it has served literally thousands of men, women and children from the Glenville area. Today it continues to flourish as the activity center of northwestern Greenwich.

From 1997 the Glenville Community led by the 9th district RTM and other concerned citizens started a fundraising campaign to reburish the Civic Center. After the group raised approximately 3.5 million dollars, the Town of Greenwich matched the gift and work began in June of 2005 with the restoration set to be completed in January, 2007. The new building will feature a state of the Art Daycare Center, a new gym/auditorium, a dance, exercise studio. Improved state of the art free weight room, meeting rooms & A.D.A. accessibility.
